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# **Content** (Course Annotation)

As part of the course, students know the definitions of cult and ritual, as well as the essential principles and expressions of worship of the Old Testament. The relationship between the worship of the Old and the New Testament is recognized, both in theological and practical terms. Students meet devotion-related texts in the Ancient Church and get notions of the development of the Eucharist celebration in the Eastern Church (Divine liturgy) and the Western Church (Mass). Special attention shall be paid to the impact of the Lutheran Reformation on the theology and practice of worship, as well as to the development of Mass in Latvian Lutheranism. A separate part of the course is devoted to learning the structure, stages, parts and texts of the service of the Eucharistic service in the Western Church. Parts and phases of it are considered in historical and practical terms: origin, theological and practical meaning, application at different times and denominations. Attention shall be paid to the practice of the individual stages and parts of the Mass in two ways specified by the evangelical Lutheran Church of Latvia. Students are familiar with the creation of a liturgical year formed as the commemorative cycle of the Salvation event and as reflected in the Mass. The course encourages the reflection of personal devotion experiences against this background. Students in the course know the traditions and basic principles of liturgical singing and acquire skills in the Lutheran Church in practice. The lessons are related to practical exercises. Students shall also know the history, structure and texts of altar fabrics, colors, the structure of the worship space, as well as the history of the order of baptisms, confirmations, marriages, funerals, etc., and the tradition of liturgy of hours. In addition to the information on the development and application of texts and procedures in different eras and denominations, special attention is paid to their practice in the evangelical Lutheran Church of Latvia.

# Aims

- To raise awareness of the origins, manifestations and meanings of liturgy in the history of the Church and today.

- Develop skills in teaching Church worship in order to engage with it in a competent capacity as both a member and ordained or lay leader.
